You're invited to our Annual Membership Meeting

At a financial cooperative like Dupaco, you're not just a member-you're an owner. And the more you participate in your credit union, the more all members benefit.

You're invited to participate in the credit union's board election and attend Dupaco's 75th Annual Membership Meeting at 1 p.m. CT Sunday, Feb. 25, 2024.

How to attend

You can attend the meeting in person with a luncheon at the Grand River Center in Dubuque, lowa, or virtually from home at <u>dupaco.com</u>.

During the meeting, you'll hear from your credit union's leadership team and board of directors about how Dupaco is performing.

With either option, you'll need to register by noon CT Feb. 20, 2024. You can register by scanning the QR code, going to dupaco.com/MemberMeeting or calling Dupaco at 800-373-7600.

Your vote counts

You can also participate in your credit union's board elections. And your vote counts!

Voting is now open to all Dupaco members who are 16 or older and a primary account holder. Dupaco's trusted partner, Credit Union Executives Society (CUES), is helping administer the election. You can vote for up to three candidates for the three open positions:

- ► Ellen Goodmann Miller*
- ► Jeff Gonner*
- ► Randy Skemp*

Additional nominations won't be taken from the floor at the membership meeting.

How to vote

There are two approved ways you can vote online or by paper ballot. But you can only vote once. And voting won't take place during the event.

Vote online: You can cast your vote by scanning the QR code or going to dupaco.com/ MemberVote. You have until 4:30 p.m. CT Feb. 15, 2024. You'll enter a username and password to vote. Your username is your member number, and your password is your eight-digit birthdate as mmddyyyy (with no spaces or special characters).

HINT If you have multiple member numbers, use the one that starts with the lowest numerical number.

Request a paper ballot: You can request a paper ballot by calling CUES at 866-356-0726. You must request your paper ballot by 4:30 p.m. CT Jan. 26, 2024. Voting instructions will be provided with your mail-in ballot. Your ballot must be postmarked by Feb. 15, 2024, and received by CUES no later than the close of business Feb. 23, 2024, to be counted. Paper ballots won't be accepted at any Dupaco branches.

Meet Ray, Dupaco's digital assistant. Ray will greet you—and be ready to help—whenever you call Dupaco.

Using Ray helps lower wait times for all callers—and gives you more access to Dupaco employees for meaningful conversations about your money.

Simply ask your question. And if Ray can't help, you'll talk to a Dupaco representative.

Ray can help with common questions, like Dupaco's routing number, branch hours and rates. Once Ray verifies your account, you'll also get quick and secure access to certain account information, like your account balance, transaction history, deposit status and more.

When you use Ray to access personal account information, you might be asked for your member number and social security number.

A code will be sent via text message or email using the information Dupaco has on file.

For your account safety, this twostep verification process is required each time you access your account. But you can skip this process when you sign up for voice biometrics. (It uses your voice as your account password!)

To enroll, you must use the phone number tied to your account. Once you complete the two-step verification process, you'll be asked if you want to enroll in voice biometrics.

We protect your voice data by converting it into a secure code and storing an encrypted version in our system. Your actual voice is not permanently recorded or saved.



DUBUQUE, Iowa—Natalie Hazewinkel will pull her car over to help a bird struggling on the side of a road.

She won't hesitate to bring stray cats to her local humane society.

Once, she even helped a raccoon.

"I have a passion for animals," the Dupaco member said. "I love them."

Naturally, Natalie stumbled into a career where her clients are ... dogs. At her mom's suggestion, she began shadowing a Dubuque groomer and eventually became one herself in 2018.

As Natalie cut and styled her clients' fur, a whisper of a thought started to take hold: Maybe she could own a grooming business someday. The whisper became a shout when her employer made plans to sell the business, and another property became available.

"The opportunity came up, and I needed to jump on it," Natalie said.

She began working with Dupaco's Chad Breitsprecker to get ready to open a full-service grooming business in Dubuque.

Chad connected Natalie with a business coach to help her create a business plan. He offered advice. And he cheered her on every step of the way.

"It would have never been able to happen without Dupaco," Natalie said. "Chad's been by my side this whole time. And he's given me a lot of good tips and tricks to make the penny go a little further."

Natalie opened Club Pawsh Grooming in November 2022.

Her first client? A white teddy bear pup she groomed on her first day as a groomer four years ago. Since then, she's taken on many returning clients. And she's learning lessons and dreaming about her business' future as she goes.


An unexpected furnace malfunction taught Natalie just how important saving

Debt consolidation loan

You may be able to roll your debts into a single personal or auto loan.

Home equity

Have home equity? You may be able to consolidate debt with a home equity loan or line of credit.

Balance transfer

You may be able to save money by transferring credit card balances to a Dupaco Visa credit card.

Refinance or restructure your loans

You may be able to refinance or restructure your loans to pay them off sooner.

You can still reach last year's savings goals

There's still time to reach last year's savings goals for retirement and health expenses.

When

You have until April 15, 2024, to contribute to these accounts for 2023*:

- ► Traditional or Roth Individual Retirement Account
- ► Health Savings Account

How much

For your IRA, you can contribute up to \$6,500 (\$7,500 if you're 50 or older) or your earned income for the year-whichever is less-for 2023.





Next tax season, consider setting up automatic recurring contributions to your IRA and HSA accounts to chip away at your goals throughout the year!

For your HSA, you can contribute up to \$3,850 for self-only coverage (\$4,850 if you're 55 or older) or \$7,750 for family coverage (\$8,750 if you're 55 or older) for 2023.

HINT All of these limits increased for the next tax year!

Added benefits

You could receive a deduction for Traditional contributions or a saver's tax credit for Traditional or Roth contributions.

HSA-eligible individuals can make tax-deductible contributions, earn tax-free dividends and withdraw money tax free for qualified medical expenses.

*Contact your tax advisor to verify eligibility and contribution limits.



My mom encouraged me to come to the United States and study English. In 2000, I moved to Madison, Wis., and stayed with one of my sisters. We spent valuable time together after many years of being separated by distance.

After those six months, I decided to stay, work and continue my studies before returning to Colombia.

However, in 2006, I married and moved to the Twin Cities, where my two sons were born. At that point, I realized that my home was here.

In 2016, I saw a posting for a position at Dupaco and applied.

Joining Dupaco has been my best professional and most rewarding decision. There is always something new to learn to protect our organization's information, data and computer systems. With the support of our board and leadership team, we strive to build a more secure Dupaco every day.

The main idea is to draw a smile on as many faces as possible. We want to offer them a ray of hope and let them know that someone, somewhere, is thinking of them.

Working at Dupaco has helped me to be a better individual and professional and to serve our members with love and passion.

My mom eventually moved to the United States to be close to my sister, her grandsons and me. She also became a proud Dupaco member!
